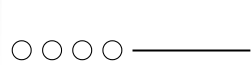

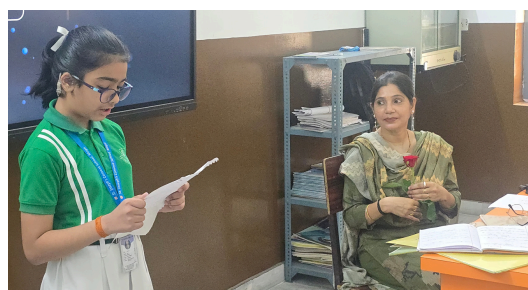

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Strong bonds, brighter futures

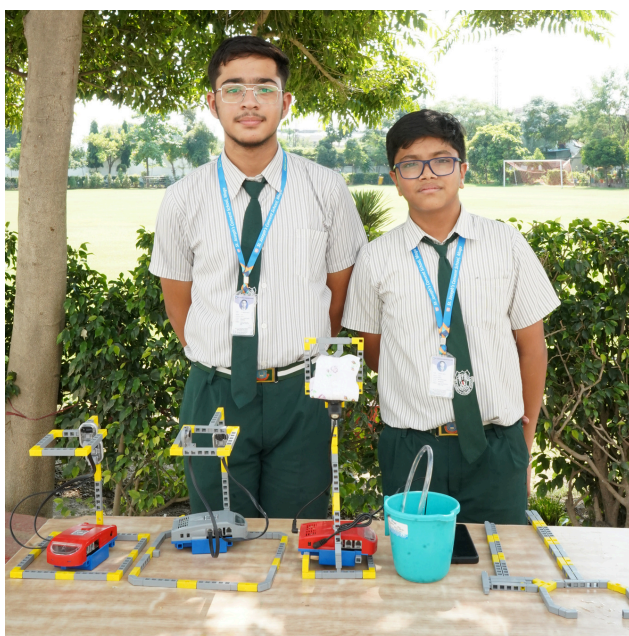

Innovation in Action



St. Joseph's Convent School, Moga, observed National Engineers' Day on 15th September 2025 with remarkable enthusiasm and creativity. The day, celebrated in honour of Sir Mokshagundam Visvesvaraya, India's legendary engineer and visionary, was marked by impressive displays of student innovation and technical imagination.

The celebrations featured sprinkler and scrubber prototypes, ingeniously designed for agricultural advancement and environmental preservation. These projects emphasized the value of water conservation, sustainable irrigation, and pollution control, proving the relevance of engineering solutions in modern farming.

Equally notable was the demonstration of a sensor-based basketball counter. This device, equipped with a high-sensitivity detector and a buzzer mechanism, was capable of accurately identifying objects and providing instant alerts. The projects were explained in detail by Dhairya Singla and Devanshu Sachdeva of Class VIII Rose, who showcased commendable confidence, clarity, and technical understanding.

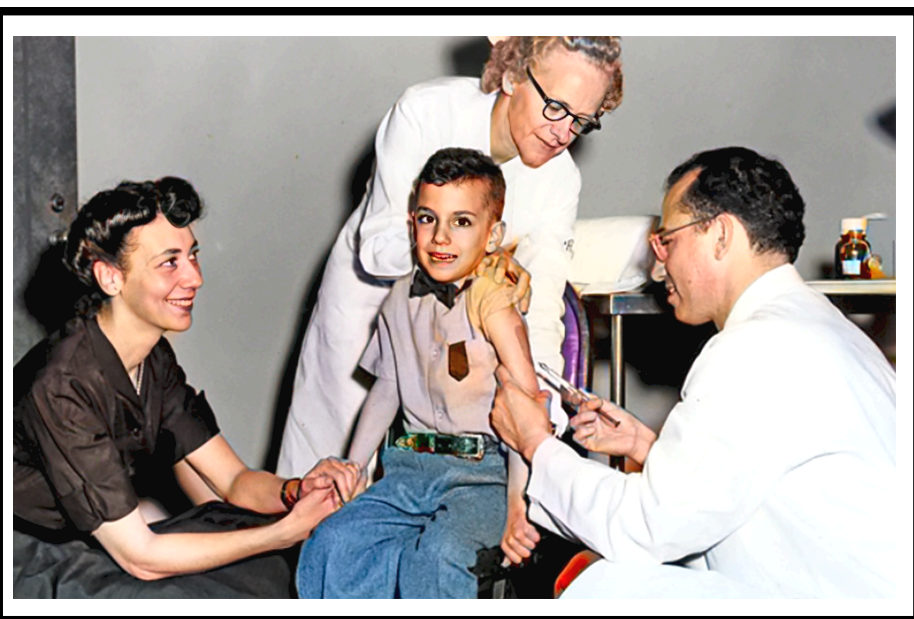
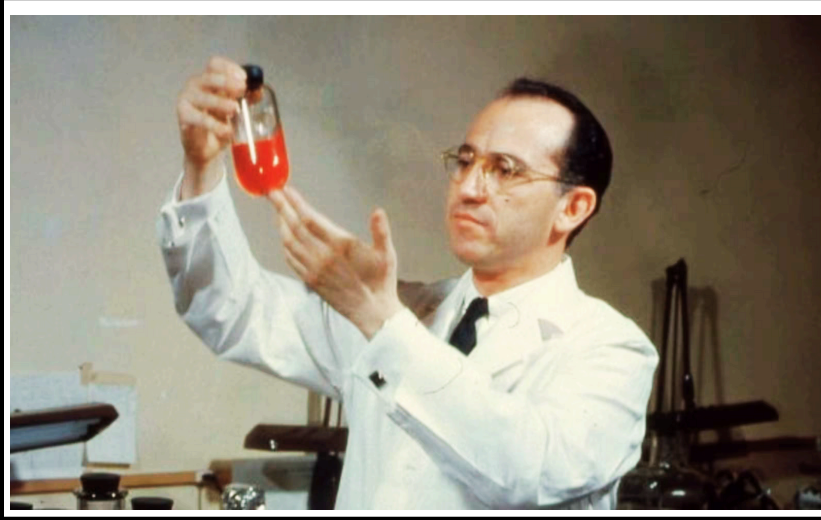


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A Shot of Hope: A Triumph of Science and Service to Humanity

On March 26, 1953, the world received historic news when Dr. Jonas Salk announced the successful development of a vaccine against polio - a disease that had long terrified families, causing paralysis and death, especially among children. In 1952 alone, the United States reported 58,000 new cases and more than 3,000 deaths, making this discovery a turning point in medical history. The announcement brought immense relief and hope to millions who had lived in constant fear of the disease.



Dr. Jonas Salk, born in New York City in 1914, studied medicine and became a leading researcher at the University of Pittsburgh. His method used killed strains of the virus to safely train the immune system. Unlike some other scientists, he chose not to patent his vaccine, saying, “Could you patent the sun?”—a decision that allowed millions of children to be vaccinated quickly. After testing on himself, his family, and former patients, large clinical trials were conducted on 1.3 million schoolchildren, who became known as the “Polio Pioneers.” In 1955, the vaccine was declared safe and effective, leading to nationwide immunization. Although an early defective batch caused setbacks, polio cases soon dropped dramatically.

Later, Dr. Albert Sabin’s oral vaccine in 1962 made distribution even easier, and polio was eventually eradicated in the United States. Today, thanks to global vaccination programs, polio has been reduced by over 99% worldwide, and complete eradication is within reach. For his extraordinary contribution to humanity, Jonas Salk received the Presidential Medal of Freedom in 1977. He passed away in 1995, but his legacy continues to inspire scientists, doctors, and students across the globe.
